There is the opportunity of taking the 'AQA GCSE Fine Art' course as well as a number of AQA unit awards, in addition pupils grow an art based portfolio to broaden Post-16 opportunities. This portfolio can be used to venture into other creative fields such as film, architecture and fashion.

Component One:

Independent work. Students grow a portfolio based on research and experimentation.

Component Two:

Introduction to externally set assignment.

Component Two:

Students create a portfolio of work based on the exam theme.

Component Two:

10 hour exam. Create a final piece for externally set assignment.
